The Medical community, like all medical services, are held to the highest standards in patient care. Most medical offices are not attached to medical centers, such as hospitals, and urgent care clinics. For this reason, the staff must be prepared to handle medical emergencies in the office and ensure that their patients are transported to a definitive level of care.
